- Grow Polio Plus over last year (\$69,787 in 2021-2022)
- Grow by at least 1 Paul Harris Society member (had 68 in 2021-2022)
- Increase new Bequest Society Members and Benefactors to at least 3.
- District communicates with club Foundation Chairs
- District promotes for clubs to have a Foundation minute at their meetings.
