Activity

82 computers were distributed throughout Honduras in 2004. Some of these went to schools and NGOs in Tela. 12 went to the John F. Kennedy School, 10 went to the Estaban Guardiola school, 2 were given to the school in La Ensenada and 2 to the San Martin school, many to the Matute computer lab, and 2 to the Jazmin school...as well as the fire department.

137 computers and 38 monitors were shipped to Honduras and distributed around the country. In the Tela area, they went to the JFK School, the school in Triunfo de la Cruz, Nueva Amanecer, Tornabe, La Ensenada, Matute, El Jazmin, and San Martin.

They also went to the water department in Masica, the fire department in Tela, the tourist police in Tela, and the National Police in Tela.


